A Star on the Far Horizon

As 2021 begins, hope shines like a star on the far horizon asking us to follow into unknown territory. Distribution of the new vaccines for COVID-19 promises that this pandemic will end, but it is unclear what the world will be like when it releases its grip on our lives. A year of varying levels of isolation and quarantine has changed just about everything: work, family life, church, education, commerce, government, and the arts. We've learned just how much we can adapt when we have to--which is a joy. But there is deep grief at all that has been lost and deep fear in the knowledge that this pandemic has changed life profoundly and forever.

One thing that has not changed is that, as Christians, we begin the year with the story of those who followed a new star into an unknown future. The Magi left their home and journeyed toward a light and a promise, though they did not know for sure what or who they would find upon their arrival. And once they had found the promised child, an angel told them they could not simply retrace the route they had come and resume the lives they had known. Instead, they had to return home by another way.

I think 2021 is going to be like that for us. There is a light on the horizon; God is coming to us in hope. And we cannot simply retrace our steps to the life we had before the pandemic. We will have to go home by another way.

The scripture does not tell us what became of the Magi once they embarked upon their homeward journey, but scripture does show us waymarks to guide us as we emerge into a changed world.

For the last several years, our congregation has embraced the spiritual practice of distributing "Star Words" on the Sunday closest to The Feast of Epiphany on January 6. Just as God showed the Magi a star that would guide them to the Christ Child, we hope that receiving a Star Word as the new year begins will guide your own prayers and contemplations in the coming weeks.

If we were worshipping in our sanctuary, each person would come forward and draw a star from the basket. Since we cannot do that this Christmas, we are sending the stars to you through the mail. If you don't receive one, call the

Worship With CPC On Line: A Brief Tutorial

There are several simple ways to navigate to our online Sunday Worship services.

From our Church Website:

1. Go to claremontpres.org. The opening screen features an image that says "Worship Online" with a button to click to learn more. If you click this link it will bring up our Link Library, with the top line featuring a hyperlink to our church Facebook Page. The hyperlink looks like this:

10:00 AM - Worship on Facebook

2. Click the word "Facebook" and it will take you to our church's Facebook page. If you do not have a Facebook account, you may see an invitation to set up an account. You can decline this and still view our Facebook page. Shortly before 10 AM on Sundays, our live video feed from the Sanctuary should be the top post.

From your web browser:

- 1. Open your browser (Safari, Firefox, Chrome, Internet Explorer, Microsoft Edge, etc.)
- 2. In the address bar, type the URL (or web address) "facebook.com/claremontpres" to navigate to Claremont Presbyterian Church's Facebook page. On Sundays, just before 10, our livestream should be the first post you see.

From Facebook:

If you are already logged on to Facebook, type Claremont Presbyterian Church in the search bar. This will bring up a link to our CPC Facebook page at the top of the list of search results. If you have not already "liked" our church page, we encourage you to do so.

To find Archived Services from previous weeks:

Go to www.clarmeontpres.org. At the top of the page, click the Worship and Music tab. This will bring up a drop down menu. From this menu, click "Sermons". This will take you to a page with recorded services from previous weeks.

Many of our services, music, and educational offerings are also viewable on our church YouTube page. Go to YouTube.com and enter "Claremont Presbyterian Church" in the search bar. You'll see our channel close to the top of the bage.


