Sunday Spiritual Formation for Children Winter/Spring 2022

Beginning on January 9 our children will have a few opportunities that will be familiar and some that will be new. Much of children's spiritual formation will come back to safe in-person classes and one class will be hybrid. We ask that you fill out a registration form for each child. They will be available in the Narthex (in the sanctuary) and with the teachers. We look forward to seeing you all in this new year.

Please check out the breakdown below:

Infant/Toddler - In-person child-care in the Children's Center building and playground during the worship service.

Early Elementary (4 yr-old -2^{nd} Grade) - In-person in the Chapel during the worship service. They will use a new curriculum as well as incorporate a craft, music, or play.

Tweens $(3^{rd} - 6^{th} \text{ Grades})$ – Hybrid classroom 1 and Zoom during the worship service. They will use a new curriculum.

Last Sunday of the month activities - Our tweens will be encouraged to partici-

pate in the worship service as able; including lighting candles, presenting the elements, and/or presenting the Bible. Early Elementary, Tweens, and preschool aged children are invited to stay with families in the service. Infants/Toddlers will be in child-care. All are invited for activities outdoors following the worship service.

Epiphany Cycle Sermon Series begins January 2

Advent rolls out slowly giving us time to contemplate its mysteries. Christmas is the dazzling center of the season: you can't miss it. But Epiphany, the third act in the Nativity drama, often plays to an empty house. By the Feast of Epiphany on January 6, we are back to work, back to school, and the tree and decorations are down and stored for the next year.

This year, beginning on Epiphany Sunday, January 2, our sermons in worship will allow for an extended look at the Epiphany story and scriptures. Catholic writer and Spiritual Director Marianne Hieb sees in the story of the Magi's journey a pattern for our own process of spiritual formation and discernment. She sees this pattern moving through nine phases:

Waiting in the darkness

Scanning the night sky

Identifying a light that is bright enough to follow

Setting out on the journey

Following the star

Identifying a gift

Entering a new place a finding God's promises are true

Offering a gift

Returning home by another way.

The sermon series will explore each of these stages on the journey using the lectionary scripture texts for Epiphany and the Sundays between Epiphany and Ash Wednesday.

Coming Soon - Adult Education Series on Aging

Multiple dynamics are associated with aging. A two-part series in January and February will explore aspects of the aging process, with particular focus on how care is given and received, and the role of spirituality in the lives of older persons.

Part 1 - Aging and Society: A Conversation about Connection and Care (Zoom), Monday, January 24 at 7 PM. How does our society view aging? What should we consider when caring for and about the seniors among us? Where is the balance between autonomy and support? The first program in this aging series will address some concerns of persons receiving care and those who give it. The presenter will be Floy Biggs (MPA) who is CEO of AgingNext, a nonprofit organization based in Claremont that provides programs, services and support for older adults, caregivers, and others concerned about aging services in the community.
