#### A Year With Matthew

In each year of its three year cycle, the Revised Common Lectionary focuses on a particular gospel. This year, that gospel is Matthew. For much of 2023, we will focus on Matthew as our primary source for preaching and worship. We will refer often to A Year with Matthew for a Matthew 25 Church, a resource from the PCUSA for churches like CPC who have made a commitment to becoming part of the Matthew 25 movement within our denomination. The gospel lectionary readings in January begin with Matthew's account of the Magi's journey, move on to the beginnings of Jesus' ministry in Galilee, and end with the opening verses of The Sermon on the Mount.

As we prepare for a sermon series on The Sermon on the Mount, our Wednesday bible study will explore The Sermon on the Mount: A Beginner's Guide to the Kingdom of God by Amy-Jill Levine. More information about that study can be found in this newsletter.

#### Our contemplative ministry is growing...

... and you are invited to be part of it.

When our weekly meditation group started several years ago, we asked, "how can we heal the rift between our daily lives and the sacred?" (It's a question that Corinne Ware asked in her book St. Benedict on the Freeway.)

Our answer was to create more opportunities for spiritual engagement during the week. Our pastors have created morning and evening prayer opportunities, we built a labyrinth and prayer garden, and on Fridays, we gather on line for 24 minutes of Centering Prayer.

Join us if you can. Our Friday Morning Meditation follows in the tradition of Centering Prayer, which was popularized in the U.S. by the late Fr. Thomas Keating. (More about him and his work at: contemplativeoutreach.org)

Most of the participants have been from CPC, but we have had others from all over the U.S, Canada, and the UK, Spain, and Asia. It's a silent meditation—no voices in the background telling you to breath or relax your muscles. Generally, we start with a little introduction about Centering Prayer, then mediate for about 24 minutes, ask for prayer concerns and moments of grace, and close with the Lord's Prayer.

Our partners at Contemplative Outreach would like you to register before providing you the links to the meditation session. This keeps people with inappropriate intentions away. Here is a link to the registration process: meditationchapel.org/getting-started. Registration is a little complex. In addition, we invite you to the CPC labyrinth and a prayer garden with a fountain and benches, both behind the sanctuary, open to the public.

Stop by any time. If you happen on the area as school is letting out you will be greeted by perhaps scores of children and their parents using the space, not always prayerfully, but nonetheless drawn to a place of spiritual awakening.


