Adult Ed - Lenten Study

This February and March we welcome back Lisa Strom to facilitate our Lenten study and to lead us in spiritual practice. Some may have missed this study the last round a couple of years ago, and others may want to dive into it a second time to gain something new. Here is what Lisa has to share about this study:

"The first time wine and a vineyard is mentioned in the Bible is Genesis. Vines have been tended and wine has been drunk as long as Judeo/ Christians have been recording history.

As I read the Bible and learn about what goes into making wine, I have seen how many amazing nuances and depths to the proverbs, parables, and tales about wine and the vine can be hidden to those who are less familiar with the world of viniculture (grape cultivating) and oenology (the science of winemaking).

The Bible is so rich in this imagery, but sometimes the depth of the story is lost in translation, the passing of time, or the lack of context. I hope to root some of these stories in the soil of context then pull back the canopy and reveal the fruit underneath."

During our bible study, we will:

- · Learn wine history, vine cultivation, and wine making information that will give deeper understanding to many passages about wine and vineyard practices that we encounter in the Bible,
- · Have opportunities to meditate on this learning with a few contemplative practices, and
- · Reflect on each passage in the context of our own lives and look for what God might be saying to us through these scriptures.

This Lenten study begins with a soup supper February 27 at 6:00 PM in the Fellowship Hall. It will continue each Monday evening at 7:00 PM in the Library and on Zoom (Mar. 6, 13, 20, 27). Zoom Meeting ID: 896 2471 1195

It will then conclude with a Wine and Cheese Tasting in late April (Date TBD)

The retreat leaders write, "This retreat will reveal and illumine our inner experience of God, in its subtle and dramatic forms. Being human is acknowledging our dependence on the Unseen, the Transcendent, the Creative Source — God. Made in God's image and likeness, mystics experience this more-than-human knowing and loving that comes from their Creator. Are we not all called to be in mystical communion with God? Paying attention to God's interventions in saintly lives can illumine our personal path of religious experience that draws us closer to God and to our true selves.
