

Being Human With Jesus

Each year the gospel reading for the first Sunday of Lent is the account of Jesus' temptation in the wilderness. For forty days, scripture relates, Jesus faced the temptation to turn bread into stone, to hurl himself off the top of the temple, to worship the Tempter in exchange for unlimited power over earthly realms. Many have commented that what the Tempter was really trying to do here was to reverse the incarnation; to make Jesus reject his humanity. If he had given in to these temptations, Jesus would have failed in his mission before it began. In coming to earth in a fully human way, Jesus came to show us--in whom the image of God had become distorted and brokenthe path to be restored to our full humanity. In living a fully human life, Jesus came to show us how to be fully human.

This Lent our Sunday worship will focus on this theme of how Jesus shows us how to be fully human. Each week we will look at some aspect of the human experience that the lectionary gospel text for that week illuminates through Jesus' words and actions.

- Information and referral to other social service programs.
- Thanksgiving Dinner Thanksgiving Day, at 11 AM.

Sunday Spiritual Formation for Children

Infant/Toddler - In-person child-care in the Children's Center building and playground during the worship

Early Elementary (4 yr-old – 2nd Grade) - In-person in the Chapel during the worship service. They will use a new curriculum as well as incorporate a craft, music, or play.

Tweens (3rd – 6th Grades) – Hybrid classroom 1 and Zoom during the worship service. They will use a new curriculum.

Elementary and Tweens will begin in worship then walked over to class following the anthem.

Last Sunday of the month activities – Our tweens will be encouraged to participate in the worship service as able; including lighting candles, presenting the elements, and/or presenting the Bible. Early Elementary, Tweens, and preschool aged children are invited to stay with families in the service. Infants/Toddlers will be in childcare. All are invited for activi-



ties outdoors following the worship service.


