Labyrinth Meditation for March

Rev. Dr. Tina Blair

Here is a guide for walking the Labyrinth this month. These are simply suggestions; your own thoughts and words will be guided by the Holy Spirit and may turn in different directions.

Spring is breaking forth around us in all its beauty.

As we begin, we take a deep breath, breathing in the smells around us, listening to all the noises of birds and wind and cars, grounding ourselves in this moment.

As we move toward the center, let's pray the (adapted) Navajo Beauty Chant. With each repetition, we can think about the beauty around us and of this spring and of this planet:

"In beauty I walk:

Beauty before me, beauty behind me;

Beauty above me, beauty below me;

Beauty beside me,

Beauty within me."

Let's repeat this chant until we get to the center.

In the center, we offer our prayers of gratitude to Christ, Giver of Life.

Remembering that Jesus Christ promised to always be with us, we pray this Celtic prayer as we wind our way out, picturing Christ with us:

"Christ before me, Christ behind me; Christ above me, Christ below me; Christ beside me, Christ to hold me; Christ within me: Christ within me."

At the end, we take a deep breath, asking Christ to be our guide this day forward.

Some of us like to repeat, and walk the labyrinth again, as second time and more.

Adult Ed - Lenten Study

This February and March we welcome back Lisa Strom to facilitate our Lenten study and to lead us in spiritual practice. Some may have missed this study the last round a couple of years ago, and others may want to dive into it a second time to gain something new. Here is what Lisa has to share about this study:

"The first time wine and a vineyard is mentioned in the Bible is Genesis. Vines have been tended and wine has been drunk as long as Judeo/ Christians have been recording history.

As I read the Bible and learn about what goes into making wine, I have seen how many amazing nuances and depths to the proverbs, parables, and tales about wine and the vine can be hidden to those who are less familiar with the world of viniculture (grape cultivating) and oenology (the science of winemaking).

The Bible is so rich in this imagery, but sometimes the depth of the story is lost in translation, the passing of time, or the lack of context. I hope to root some of these stories in context then pull back the canopy and reveal the fruit underneath."

During our bible study, we will:

- · Learn wine history, vine cultivation, and wine making information that will give deeper understanding to many passages about wine and vineyard practices that we encounter in the Bible,
- · Have opportunities to meditate on this learning with a few contemplative practices, and
- · Reflect on each passage in the context of our own lives and look for what God might be saying to us through these scriptures.

This Lenten study begins with a soup supper February 27 at 6:00 PM in the Fellowship Hall. It will continue each Monday evening at 7:00 PM in the Library and on Zoom (Mar. 6, 13, 20, 27). Zoom Meeting ID: 896 2471 1195

It will then conclude with a Wine and Cheese Tasting in late April (Date TBD)

Also, look out for a quarterly series from Adult Ed (4 Sunday mornings in 2023).

Generous grants and donors made it possible to build a budget for the first year. Now the Lead Team is taking a leap of faith into year two as they are discerning ways to sustain the cost of this missional endeavor. for anyone desiring to hear more from members of this congregation. If you would like to attend, please let Pastor Brian know.


January 25 Session Highlights
