Coming Home to a Place We've Never Been Before

I'm dating myself by this memory—but I recall very well these lines from John Denver's Colorado Rocky Mountain High about a young man who "came home to a place he'd never been before." In the context of that song, the line means something about going to a place you've never been and discovering that it feels like home.

We may experience this line in the opposite way soon. As the pandemic ebbs and we are able to worship in our sanctuary we may discover that we have come "home" only to discover that it is a place we have never been. We have never been in this place as a congregation. We've never been a church that has survived a pandemic. We've never been a church discerning God's call to reach out and help our community heal from the scars of a global pandemic and a year of bruising political dissension and upheaval. We've never been a church that learned new technology at lightning speed in order to stay connected during quarantine. The sanctuary is the same: it is our beautiful and sacred space—but we are in a place that we have never been before as a congregation. The sanctuary will embrace our return--but in many ways we can never go back to where we were when we last worshipped there together in early March of 2020. We will celebrate being there together... and we will pray for wisdom as we search for new ways of being faithful in this new post-pandemic place that we find ourselves.

At its April 28 meeting, the Session will consider a recommendation to begin in person worship in the sanctuary on the first Sunday of June, (the 6th). Soon after that, we will publicize plans via our church website, social media, e-newsletter, and a letter to our mailing list. God will be with us as we celebrate being both home and in a new place.

Presbyterian Disaster Assistance

The One Great Hour Special Offering is collected on Easter/Palm Sunday. The funds donated from the congregation for this offering are given 100% to Presbytery. Those funds are divided to support three major ministry areas, 36% Hunger, 32% Disaster, and 32% Self Development

From the start of the pandemic through the end of 2020, the Presbyterian Disaster Assistance response program gave 476 grants totaling \$3,469,619.28 to 56 countries and 125 Presbyterian mid-councils supported in the US. Because of the church's historic generosity and One Great Hour of Sharing, \$2.7 million from reserves was able to be pulled to respond to COVID19. Presbyterian Disaster Assistance facilitated an additional \$300,000 for Matthew 25 Continuity of Ministry Grants of up to \$7,500 each for congregations whose survival might have been in question due to the impact of COVID19. Some of the grants supported Native American communities including the Dakota Presbytery, Navajo Nation and the Wind River Reservation. 2020 also saw record numbers of wildfires, and PDA was able to provide support. In total, PDA was able to provide support of more than \$6.5 million.

During the month of November, Guatemala, Honduras, and Nicaragua were struck by back to back hurricanes resulting in flooding and the loss of housing and food. In Guatemala alone, PDA's support included providing food to about 1,560 people, garden seeds to 144 families, and hygiene kits to 1,090 people. Grants were distributed to countries in Africa, including Nigeria, where 500 water sanitation and hygiene kits were distributed, along with water storage and hand-washing stations. In South Sudan mosquito nets, face masks, sleeping mats, plastic sheets for shelter, rubber ropes, blankets and kitchen essentials were distributed to 55 households after flooding and 1,500 hygiene kits were also given out to households in need. After the Beirut explosion material relief for rebuilding was provided, food and hygiene support for 150 refugee families from Palestine and Syria were also given to Lebanon, as well as 1,500 hygiene kits. In Nepal PDA distributed gloves, masks and hand sanitizers as well as provided education around pandemic preventive measures and psychosocial support.

As of April 9 CPC has donated \$2837.00. Fish banks are being collected and added to these funds. The Mission Interpretation Commission thanks the CPC congregation for all your support of Presbyterian Disaster Assistance ministries.

Session Approves Summer Sabbatical for Pastor Karen Sapio

At its March meeting, Session approved an 8 week sabbatical for Pastor Sapio from June 28 - August 23. Pastor Karen's last sabbatical was during the summer of 2014. She plans to spend the time doing some writing projects, and visiting family she has not seen since the beginning of the pandemic. She is working with Pastor Brian, staff, and Session to ensure continuity of worship and administrative leadership during her time away.

PC(USA) Special Offerings - Pentecost

Our next special offering will be the Pentecost offering, which is collected during the weeks around Pentecost (Sunday, May 23, 2021). This offering goes to support young people and inspire them to share their faith, ideas, and unique gifts with the church and the world.

While much of our special offering collections are split between the denomination and the presbytery, the Pentecost offering allows for 40% of the collection to stay with the congregation.

This year the Education & Leadership Commission has decided to designate our portion to go to the Immigrant Accompaniment Organizing ministry of the Presbytery and specifically to support the work with unaccompanied minors. Session Highlights, March 24, 2021

Highlights from the March Session meeting for your information:

- Adopted CPC operational levels for each LA County colored tier, based on recommendations by the LA County Department of Public Health.
- Approved a two-month sabbatical for Pastor Karen, from June 26 through August 22, 2021.
- Approved a job description for a new position, Livestream Worship and Tech Coordinator. Initial funding will come from the Emerging Ministries funds from the 60th Anniversary Capital Campaign.
- Wished Elder Jenny Eazell well in her internship in Hawaii. Barbara MacKenzie will fill in as chair of Children's Center Commission in Jenny's absence.

The role of Worship Tech Coordinator is to take the lead in overseeing the livestream and audio visual worship needs of the Church, including leadership of volunteer technical teams for Sunday Morning Services and other worship events needing production and tech support. The right candidate has sufficient technical abilities to help advance our live-stream ministry.

Duties:

- 1. Support of Live Stream for Sunday morning worship is the number one priority of this position.
- 2. The Technical Coordinator will oversee all technical

- 3. Sound set up and maintenance including wireless lapel microphones
- 4. Computer graphics including creating lyrics and other text in ProProducer as required
- 5. livestream and video presentation, both live and pre-recorded, of Sunday morning services.
- 6. Lead our tech team by training, assisting, scheduling and coordinating tech arts volunteers. Work with clergy and lay staff to identify and recruit tech team members.
- 7. Build a community of tech volunteers rooted in CPC's mission of hospitality, nurture, mission and inclusion.
- 8. Collaborate with the Pastor and Director of Music in the production and development of our worship services, and other gatherings as necessary and ensure appropriate level of media support. In addition to onsite live streaming, this may include actual production of pre-recorded service elements.
- 9. Research and develop new ways to broadcast/stream media via satellite, fiber, and the web to our local retirement communities and the wider online community.
- 10. Ensure CPC maintains audio and video archives of worship services.
- 11. Assist staff and volunteers in mastering AV technology, empowering and equipping our CPC team to use technology in discipleship and ministry.
- 12. Coordinate volunteers and assist with special services such as weddings or funerals as needed.
- 13. Assist the leadership team in securing equipment bids/upgrades as projects develop.
- 14. Understanding of preparing recorded material for linking to the church website is a plus
- 15. Assess future technology needs and work to implement purchase strategies and timelines in coordination with the Tech task force or committee and the business office.
- 16. Responsible for maintaining inventory of purchases, technology, passwords, etc.
- 17. Practice excellent stewardship of church funds.
- 18. Ability to oversee tech interns.
- 19. Perform other duties as assigned.

Qualifications:

- Working knowledge of current audio, video, livestream, social media technology, lighting and video production systems in a live worship setting.
- Experience or familiarity with running a live stream via OBS to platforms such as Vimeo, Facebook, YouTube for
