

Campus Safety Protocols Modified

On June 15, the Los Angeles County Department of Public Health issued a new directive lifting many COVID-related safety mandates and replacing them with guidance on best practices. On June 23, session approved these new guidelines.

The Health Department continues to strongly encourage masks for large indoor gatherings where not everyone is vaccinated. We also want to ensure that children, (who cannot yet receive vaccinations) and their families feel safe and welcome in worship. Therefore we will continue to ask those attending worship in our sanctuary to wear masks at this time.

- 1. Because we are masking, WE CAN SING!
- 2. To assist in containing any spread of new variants of the virus, we will continue to check in worshipers in case contact tracing is needed.
- 3. We will continue to seat worshipers in alternate pews for the time being.
- We will continue to maintain a low touch environment, including receiving our offering in boxes in the narthex following worship, and using presealed cups for communion.
- 5. Individually packaged drinks and food may be served at Coffee Hour and other events.

Session will revisit these guidelines at its next meeting on August 25 and make adjustments as appropriate. If you have questions or concerns about any of these guidelines, please speak to a pastor or member of Session.

Beware of Scams

There are a number of Internet phishing scams that target members of faith communities. Often these come as an email from someone pretending to be the Pastor or other church staff requesting that a member purchase gift cards for a church project of charitable effort. Often the emails instruct the recipient NOT to call the staff person because they are tied up in meetings.

Please know that no member of CPC's staff would email a church member or friend requesting that they make any kind of financial transaction on behalf of the staff person or the congregation. If you receive an unexpected message from one of us asking you to do this, please delete it and report the incident to the church office. If you are ever unsure if a particular email is actually from a member of our staff, please verify with a phone call to the staff person or to the church office.

Celebrate July 4 with the Kids at Pomona Fairplex: Fill Their Goinghome Bags

As we remember the American dream of freedom on July 4, let's also remember the children who have crossed our southern border alone in search of freedom from oppressive situations, including violent crime and poverty. So far about 500 children, "unaccompanied minors," mostly between 8 and 17 years old, have been housed at the Pomona Fairplex site at a time, but the numbers are constantly changing as some are released to relatives and others arrive.

Claremonters are asking how they can help. We've been advised that while the children are there, they are cared for by professionals and there is little opportunity for volunteers to interact with them. They receive schooling, medical care, recreation, and emotional support care, since many are seriously traumatized by their previous lives, the journey here, and separation from their families. Still there are needs.

The Latino Family Institute in Pomona is looking for bi-lingual teachers and teachers' aides. The languages spoken are Spanish, Mandarin, and many indigenous languages of Central America. About 20% of the children have no relatives or sponsors waiting for them. Therefore some foster families will be urgently needed. For information: www.lfiservices.org.

What all of us can do is to help provide materials for departure bags to be given to the children as they leave Pomona and travel to their new homes in the US. On Sunday, July 4, we will be collecting donations. What is needed? Visa, Amazon or other gift cards, books (preferably Spanish or bilingual), school supplies (such as notepads, pens), international phone cards, coloring and doodle books, English learning materials, travel-size hygiene supplies, feminine hygiene products, hair ties, prepackaged snacks (trail mix, nuts, cookies, crackers,) hairbrushes and combs, socks and underwear, sweatshirts/hoodies (S-XL),

lightweight throw blankets. Cash donations can also be made electronically or by checks to Claremont Presbyterian Church, with the designation Fairplex kids.



Generous Pentecost Offering Will Aid Unaccompanied Immigrant Children

Thank you to everyone who contributed to our Pentecost Offering. Sixty percent of that offering goes to the Presbyterian Church, USA to support its ministries that encourage, develop, and support its young people, and also address the needs of at-risk children. Forty percent stays with the local congregation to support its own work with these same initiatives. This year, CPC agreed to contribute our 40% to assist unaccompanied immigrant minors currently housed at the Pomona Fairplex. These children, as young as nine months and as old as 17. come from violent areas of Central America and are housed at Fairplex until they can be safely reunited with relatives or other family connections in the United States. help provide "reunification boxes" that will include supplies and gift cards for groceries to help ease the transition of the child to its new household. Our 40% totaled \$556 which will be matched by funds from our Mission Commission and Refugee Concerns Team. Our prayers and blessings go along with our contributions.

Claremont Presbyterian Church Expands Solar Array

In 2016, our church installed its first solar panel array on the south facing roof of our Fellowship Hall. On Friday June 4, our solar contractor completed installation of our new PV solar. The 15 new panels, one array of 3, and one array of 12, are on the west end of Fellowship Hall. This orientation captures sun power in the afternoon, when electric rates are highest. With our mostly sunny weather right now, we can compare production before and after addition of the new panels and inverter. On May 31, with our old configuration, our power output was 82 kWh. On June 6, with our new panels installed and operating, our output was 110 kWh, a 34% increase. These new panels are helping our congregation be better stewards of the planet God entrusted to our care. Thanks to CPC member Thomas Bleakney whose vision, dedication, and generosity made this new installation possible.
