

# Stories from the Road: A Sermon Series for Summer

Much of scripture is stories from the road. We hear of Abraham and Sarah on the road to Canaan, Moses on the road to challenge Pharaoh, Ruth and Naomi on the road to Bethlehem, Jesus and his disciples walking the highways and byways of Galilee and Judea, Paul encountering Christ on the Road to Damascus and many more. What's more, we often speak of faith as a journey and the Christian faith particularly as "walking the path of Jesus."

What do we learn from these stories from the road? During the summer months when many of us find ourselves on the road to various destinations, we'll take a close look at some of these journeys. Many of these journeys take place in the middle of a crisis, or in response to a disaster. Some are journeys away from one set of loyalties and realities into a completely new life. In many cases, the external journey is mirrored by a parallel inner journey of the heart and spirit.


