



## Guest Preacher on Sunday, August 20th

The Rev. Elmarie Parker and her husband The Rev. Scott Parker have ministered together from Beirut, Lebanon since 2013. Elmarie Parker serves as regional liaison to Iraq, Syria and Lebanon. The heartbeat of her work is to help deepen and strengthen the relational ties between the church in her region and the church in the United States and to develop the practical ministries that are birthed from these relationships. More specifically, she facilitates Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) support for partner programs and activities and implements partnership strategy. Elmarie assists in strengthening healthy, effective and appropriate relationships among entities of the PC(USA) and those of partner denominations and organizations in the region. This often takes shape through PC(USA) group solidarity and learning visits to Syria, Lebanon and Iraq facilitated by Elmarie. Additionally, Elmarie supports other PC(USA) associates serving in this region through communications, information sharing, mentoring/ guiding, encouraging and reflection.

Elmarie and Scott have been key partners in our ongoing support for refugees from the conflict in that region, both in Lebanon and here in the U.S. Claremont Presbyterian Church is part of the PCUSA's Syria/Lebanon Partner Network which held its annual meeting here last September.
