World Communion Sunday, October 1

The first Sunday in October is designated as World Communion Sunday, which celebrates our oneness in Christ with all our brothers and sisters around the world.

World Communion Sunday is also a time when we receive the annual Peace and Global Witness Offering as a way of continuing the ancient Christian practice of sharing what we have with brothers and sisters in need. Twenty-five percent of this offering stays with our congregation to support the peacemaking and reconciliation efforts of our congregation. This year, our Mission Commission voted to send our portion to support Presbyterian Disaster Relief's work in the area of Maui devastated by fires this summer. Maui may not seem "local," but Hawaii is part of the Synod of Southern California and Hawaii of which Claremont is a part. The Mission Commission will match the contributions up to \$500.

Advent Retreat at Saint Andrew's Abbey

On **December 11-13**, take some time for reflection and prayer during a season that can at times seem stressful, hectic, or lonely. Wednesdays at 4:00 PM our study group will explore *Dancing in the Darkness: Spiritual Lessons for Thriving in Turbulent Times,* by Otis Moss III. Reviewers have described this book as a "life-affirming" guide to the practical, political, and spiritual challenges of our day. Drawing on the teachings of Dr. King, Howard Thurman, sacred scripture, southern wisdom, global spiritual traditions, Black culture, and his own personal experiences, Dr. Moss instructs us on how to practice spiritual resistance by combining justice and love. This collection helps us tap into the spiritual reserves we all possess but too often overlook, so we can slay our personal demons, confront our civic challenges, and reach our highest goals.
