Many holiday celebrations begin with a journey home; either to an actual place or to be with the family or friends that make any place home. In the midst of these journeys someone nearly always asks the question, "Are we there yet?"

Advent is the ultimate holiday journey. We are making our way toward the home long promised where

The wolf shall live with the lamb, the leopard shall lie down with the kid, the calf and the lion and the fatling together, and a little child shall lead them...<sup>9</sup>They will not hurt or destroy on all God's holy mountain; for the earth will be full of the knowledge of the Lord as the waters cover the sea.

## Presbyterian Synod of Syria and Lebanon seeking our help

Many of you have heard about the economic crisis in Lebanon and Syria. The Lebanese currency has lost more than 90% of its value against the US dollar resulting in severe inflation and pushing more than 50% of the population of Lebanon into poverty.

The synod of the Presbyterian Church in Syria and Lebanon oversees seven private schools in Lebanon and three in Syria. The schools used to fund a great portion of the Synod's ministry work in Syria and Lebanon. These schools enrolled around 10,000 students. Because of the dire economy, hundreds of skilled and experienced workers are leaving Lebanon in order to support their families, including teachers from the Synod schools.

The situation in Lebanon was discussed at the refugee committee and then taken to the mission commission. The mission commission voted to send \$1000 to the Presbyterian Synod in Syria and Lebanon to help with the situation.
