Straw for the Manger: Matthew 25 and Christmas

In 2022 Claremont Presbyterian Church joined the PCUSA's Matthew 25 initiative. This movement within the denomination urges churches to place Christ's call in Matthew 25: 31-46 to care for the hungry, thirsty, vulnerable, and imprisoned at the heart of our ministries. At his birth in Bethlehem Jesus, along with Mary and Joseph, were vulnerable in many of these ways. They were far from home, dependent upon others, and persecuted by Herod and the power of empire.

As we light our Advent candles in worship this month, we will also add straw to an empty manger, preparing to welcome this child born vulnerable and in danger in a hostile world. We will gather the straw of hope, love, peace, and joy as a sign that we are preparing to work and pray on behalf of the hungry, homeless, and persecuted in this world. We gather the straw of hope, love, peace, and joy as a sign that we seek to be a community of healing, where we can bring the hungry, thirsty, and lonely parts of ourselves and find a welcome.

For those who wish to go deeper, our Advent Devotional, *Straw for the Manger* will be available in the Narthex beginning November 27. There will also be copies available in the church office and online at bit.ly/3tBYOad.

Celebrating the CPC Sanctuary Choir!

Throughout its history, one of the treasures of the Claremont Presbyterian Church has been the Church's remarkable musical heritage and the congregation's steadfast support for great music that affirms our faith. The pillar of this heritage is our glorious CPC Sanctuary Choir, which continues to inspire us in worship through song on a weekly basis.

Our choir is composed of busy, talented singers who somehow make the Church's music ministry a priority in their lives. During the two years in which the pandemic was such a trying time for all of us, the Sanctuary Choir responded by forming a "Virtual Choir" with the assistance of technical experts John Watts and Mark MacKenzie.

As the pandemic restrictions have been lifted the Sanctuary Choir is indeed singing in the sanctuary once again. After its presentation of the *Pandemic Requiem* in April, the Choir has continued to energize our worship services through skillful offerings in a variety of musical styles.

During the past three months alone, the Choir has presented Gospel-influenced selections such as "Have Mercy on Me" by Clayton White and "Total Praise" by Richard Smallwood; a South African anthem, "Ukuthula", for World Communion Sunday; a Dan Forrest arrangement of the traditional American folk melody "How Firm a Foundation"; and J.S. Bach's "Sleepers Wake!" characterized by many as "the King of Chorales."

The Choir is a caring community of individuals who have fun and support each other. They are committed to presenting the music in a way that transcends mere notes and words, to present a worship experience that reflects the conviction of their musical message.

Currently the Sanctuary Choir is preparing its presentation of *Sing We Now of Christmas* by contemporary American composer Howard Helvey. This cantata is a collection of seven familiar Christmas carols that are presented in a playful yet worshipful way through fresh harmonic interpretations of the music.

During this preparation time our Choir rehearsals are being held from 7:15 PM to 9:15 PM every Thursday in the Music Building and on Zoom, with an additional workshop scheduled from 1 to 3 PM on December 11. You are welcome to join us!

As we look to the Advent season, let us celebrate the CPC Sanctuary Choir and the incredible musical gifts that it provides throughout the year.

Advent Bible Study

Beginning Wednesday, November 3O at 4:30 PM, go on a spiritual journey this Advent with this four-session study written by Kathleen Long Bostrom. It introduces participants to several spiritual practices that can help deepen their personal faith journeys. Each session includes Scripture for reflection, activities centered on biblical passages that tell the Advent story, and a prayer practice.


