# How Does A Weary World Rejoice?

The classic Christmas hymn, O Holy Night, includes the line "...a thrill of hope—a weary world rejoices!" The world certainly is weary as this Christmas approaches. How exactly does a weary world rejoice? This is the question we will explore this Advent in worship, Bible Study, and personal devotions. We will use resources from A Sanctified Art, a worship resource put together by a group of Presbyterian clergywomen who are also artists, poets, and musicians. The themes for the four weeks of Advent suggest possible answers to this question. How does a weary world rejoice?

We acknowledge our weariness—as did the prophets and poets of scripture

We find joy in connection—as did Mary and Elizabeth

We sing stories of hope—as did Zechariah

We make room—as did the stable in Bethlehem

If you don't have one already, pick up an Advent devotion in the narthex on Sunday or in the church office during the week. Let us bear one another's weariness and come together in hope.
