From the Pastor

Windows on Eastertide

Every time someone enters our sanctuary, they experience the gospel--even if they are here for a concert or a lecture and not a worship service. How is that possible? Our stained glass windows. The twenty-four windows that line the east and west walls of the sanctuary were specifically designed to tell the story of Christ and illuminate the means of grace. These windows "preach" the good news no matter what event draws people into our common worship space.

This Eastertide (the 50 days between Easter and Pentecost) our worship will highlight seven of the symbols depicted in those windows that are particularly related to the stories in Acts that are part of the post-Easter cycle of lectionary readings. What a wonderful chance to learn more about the art in our sanctuary and about the symbols of our faith!

The real windows of Eastertide, though, are the windows that open up when Christ's resurrection power flows through us and give other glimpses of the Realm of God. You can be part of those windows this month by holding our church in prayer, by participating in Jazz Vespers, by volunteering to be part of our first Laundry Love outreach collaboration, by welcoming families at our Family Night Mixer, and many other ministries that you will read about in this newsletter.

Let's be windows through which others see God's love at work in the world!

Laundry Love Project Volunteers Needed

Since the ending of the Community Meal ministry, the Mission Interpretation Commission (MIC) has been reaching out to explore other possible ministries to the food insecure. Nora Quinn, from the Deacons, and Carol Sittig, from MIC, have visited and participated in the Laundry Love Project in Pomona and would like to invite the CPC congregation to join us in this ministry on May 15 to provide a meal and gain further insight and contribution in evaluating this ministry as a new way for CPC to minster to the low-income and no-income people in our community.

Laundry Love, as a larger organization, began in 2003 after a conversation in Ventura with a homeless man called T-Bone. In one conversation he was asked, "How can we come alongside your life in a way that would matter?" He replied "If I had clean clothes I think people would treat me more like a human being". Laundry Love in Pomona was started in 2014 by St. Ambrose, Claremont and St John's, La Verne and is coordinated by Julie McCurdy from St. Ambrose and Kathy Winsor from St. John's.

The third Wednesday of each month Laundry Love Project of Pomona invites homeless and low income people to wash and dry up to eight loads of clothing and bedding at a laundromat in Pomona between the hours of 6 – 8 PM. Currently that is at Lucy's Laundry Mat at 365 W. Holt Ave., Pomona, on the corner of Holt and Park. On average about 50 families bring an average of 450 loads of laundry per month. St Ambrose, St John's, St Mark's of, Upland and St Paul's of Pomona provide the foundational funding along with a one year grant from Tri-City Mental Health Services (which expires the end of June). Other organizations are pitching in with funding and volunteers, and we would like to invite CPC to be one of those partners. 100% of all donated money goes towards the purchase of coins for the machines, laundry detergent and drying sheets. No donated funds go towards administrative costs. Volunteers offer their time to set up washers and dryers, and

provide a small dinner for the people while they wait for their laundry to finish. The food is donated from partner organizations and that is what MIC is asking CPC to provide on May 15.

We need 6 volunteers who are each willing to cook and deliver a lasagna that will serve 25, with one serving being 1 cup. We need volunteers willing to provide either a lettuce salad or fruit (apples, bananas, pears, etc) as a side dish to serve 150 people. Please contact MIC Chair Carol Sittig at sittigcarol@gmail.com if you would be willing to provide some of this needed food. We need the food delivered to us at Lucy's Laundry Mat by 5:30 PM, May 15, so we can set up the table inside the laundry mat before the people start washing their clothes at 6pm. If you are not able to deliver your food, please let Carol Sittig know that as well so that we might be able to coordinate other arrangements. Thank you in advance for celebrating the dignity of each human being.

Bag-It Sunday – June 9

One of the many ways CPC assists the needy through the Inland Valley Hope Partners is Bag -It Sunday. After church on June 9 we will assemble hygiene kits for the homeless. As we fill each bag, we visit with one another, and appreciate having the basic necessities ourselves. Start collecting hygiene supplies now, bring them to church the week before (June 2) and plan to join us after church on June 9 to participate in this meaningful outreach to those in need.

Ways you can help include:

- Saving individual-sized hygiene articles as you travel or purchase them from the following list.
- Shopping for individual-sized hygiene supplies, such as soap, washcloths, shampoo, toothbrushes, toothpaste, socks (women's and men's), deodorant, razers, shaving cream, combs, anti-bacterial lotion (not gel), lip balm, sunblock, and snack packs like nuts, dried fruits, energy bars.
- Bringing items to CPC before June 2 so the Deacons can purchase what is needed.
- Making a monetary donation so the Deacons can purchase needed items place in the offering plate, marked Bag-It, find the Deacons on the patio after church May 19 June 2, or mail checks to the church, with the designation "Bag-It Sunday" in the memo.
- Joining us to assemble the hygiene kits after church on June 9
