#### From the Pastor

Summer Sermon Series: "We Need to Talk..."

Several decades ago, Jewish philosopher Martin Buber remarked, "That peoples can no longer carry on authentic dialogue with one another is not only the most acute symptom of the pathology of our time, it is also that which most urgently makes a demand of us. I believe, despite all, that the peoples in this hour can enter into dialogue, into a genuine dialogue with one another."

Things have not gotten better since he wrote those words. In these days of shock radio, Facebook rants, and polarized media outlets, authentic dialogue is harder than ever. Pastor and author C. Christopher Smith suggests that one role for the church in the  $21^{\rm st}$  century might be to offer a space and community where deep conversations about things that matter can still happen.

In recent weeks our pastors and other congregational leaders have asked church and members of the wider Claremont community, "What do we need to talk about?" The answers they received are for the basis for our Summer Sermon series, "We Need to Talk…"

In addition to the sermons, each week there will be opportunities for conversations around each topic. Watch the Sunday bulletin, the weekly e-newsletter, and our CPC Facebook page for news about these opportunities. The series will begin in late June and continue through August.

Inland Valley Hope Partners (IVHP) is a collaboration of faith communities, businesses, individuals and community groups. Their mission is to ensure the empowerment of people in need, by providing food, shelter and supportive services. CPC supports the Inland Valley Hope Partners (IVHP) ministries in many ways. To give a few examples: Mission and Deacons provide monthly financial support. Individuals drop off food into the red wheelbarrow in our church Narthex and deliver it to the Beta Center. As a token of appreciation, IVHP invited CPC to their volunteer Appreciation Luncheon on Friday April 26. Pastor Brian and Mission Chair, Carol Sittig attended.

## About the Memorial Garden

For many generations of Christians, the traditional churchyard with its headstones was a visible and powerful reminder that, "in life and in death we belong to God."

The Memorial Garden of Claremont Presbyterian Church is a modern version of the churchyard. It is provided for the scattering or interment of cremains (ashes) of present and past members of Claremont Presbyterian Church, Emmanuel Church, Claremont Korean Church, and GPIB Indonesian Fellowship and the community.

The Memorial Garden is located along the west side of the church, between the Sanctuary and the church office. The Garden is surrounded by stone walls and wrought iron fencing. During regular office hours the garden is accessible to all and is locked for security when the office is closed.

Three options are available in the Memorial Garden of Claremont Presbyterian Church:

The Garth is provided for the scattering of ashes or the burial of ashes in a biodegradable manner. The name, date of birth, and the date of death will be engraved upon the Garth Cenotaph for each person so memorialized in the Garth. A key to the Memorial Garden will be provided with each license. (Cenotaph engraving requires at least 2 weeks notice.)

The Burial Garden is provided for the permanent interment of cremains beneath the ground. The name, date of birth, and the date of death will be engraved upon the Garden Cenotaph for each person interred. Urns for cremains will be provided by the church. Licensee may have the name of the deceased placed on the urn at his/her own expense. A key to the Memorial Garden will be provided with each license. (Cenotaph engraving requires at least 2 weeks notice.)

The Wall of Remembrance is provided for the engraving of the names of loved ones buried elsewhere. Call the church office at (909) 624-9693 for more details.
