#### From the Pastor

The 2020 Vision Team was mandated by the 222nd General Assembly (2016) and charged with developing a guiding statement for the denomination as it moves into the future. The following draft statement is now before the Church for study and contemplation. Beginning September 8, a five week sermon series will focus on the five themes of the statement.

God calls the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) to be:

#### Prayerful

Confessing our sin to God and those we have wronged, we accept our responsibility for the brokenness in the world and in ourselves. In Christ we are assured of forgiveness and freed to forgive others. We ask the Holy Spirit to direct and guide us as we actively listen to Scripture and fully engage in the joys and challenges of life in this present world. By grace Christ binds us together, cleanses us in the waters of baptism, nourishes us at the Lord's table, and sends us out to share the Good News.

#### Courageous

Reformed and always being reformed, we follow the Holy Spirit in new and imaginative ways to places we have not yet been. We foster the hope of reconciliation in Christ who transforms the world through healing individuals and communities. We work for God's justice and peace for all people in every land, walking with the vulnerable, the marginalized, and the abused.

#### United

As members of the Church universal, we are Christ's disciples, called by God and empowered by the Holy Spirit. Against forces that seek to divide, Christ compels us to bear witness to a love that connects communities across great differences. We approach others in a spirit of openness and trust as we follow Jesus Christ in respecting the freedom of other religions, worldviews, and traditions.

#### Serving

Gratefully following the One who washed his disciples' feet, we listen to our neighbors, working to meet their practical needs. We partner with others to become the hands and feet of God in the world, showing compassion and generosity to all creation. The Holy Spirit pushes us

## **CPC Mission Partner - CLASP**

Would you like to spend a few hours a week helping a vulnerable child with homework, and be a friend? Are you new to the area or recently retired? Do you know someone who is? CLASP needs over 250 caring volunteers each year – people like Pat Reed, Greg Stout and Carol West.

CPC has supported CLASP in a variety of ways since 2002, from providing space for a tutoring site and office, to financial donations from the Mission Commission and Alternative Holiday Market.

CLASP annually serves about 150 elementary school students at five sites throughout the community. Teachers refer students for different reasons: not completing homework on time, struggling to grasp necessary concepts for grade-level work, having trouble getting organized, losing focus on academic tasks, mismanaging time and lacking confidence in their ability to complete school work. These students are in need of an environment that provides strong academic support and a quiet place to study so they can complete their homework.

The program includes tutoring and mentoring from caring volunteers with a goal of one-to-one, recreation and enrichment, healthy snacks and transportation, three sessions a week for 2 hours. Students are generally 81% low income, 31% homeless, 89% minorities

Student quotes: "I felt shy and nervous in the beginning with my tutors, but now it feels like I'm talking to my own family. I prefer to do my homework at CLASP." "At CPC I learn better. My tutors review my homework as well. They are kind."

From parents: "In reading, he has been having a problem since kindergarten - he blends vowel sounds. He has improved a lot." "Before he was barely making his grades. Now he is getting 4's and excellents. I credit his improvement to the one-on-one from CLASP. He has always liked school. But he needs extra time to understand the material. The different ways of approaching the material has helped him.

#### **Godly Play Returns**

Godly Play, our Sunday School class for children in the elementary grades, will begin on September 1. You may register your child for Godly Play and sign them in each week in the church narthex with one of the Godly Play helpers. It takes place during the church service following the "time with the children." After the passing of the peace, the children will walk with their Godly Play teacher to the Chapel.

Godly Play helps children to gain religious language, explore through stories with visuals in a calm, meditative environment and learn through wonder and play. Following the Bible story, the children might do arts and crafts or go play on the playground. After the service, you can sign your child out either at the Chapel or the nursery building.

Healthy conversation was had among friends, several of whom were new friends from around the city. Each conversation concluded with the question, "What is this conversation calling you to do, what is your next step?"

Forty children and thirty-five volunteers participated in CPC's successful Roar! Vacation Bible School during the last week of June. Children from age 3 through 5thgrade from not only our congregation, but also from the Children's Center and the community had a great time while building both faith and a shared sense of community. Each evening included music during opening and closing times with Pastor Brian, Bible stories with Pastor Karen, crafts with Kim Brinegar and Delight Slotemaker de Bruin, videos and discussion about various children in Africa with Mark MacKenzie, games with Thomas Randles and his helpers and delicious dinners prepared by Kyungah Jung and the kitchen crew. None of this could have happened without the many hours of preparation led by our Summer Interns who also worked hard, along with other volunteers, shepherding our children as "Crew Chiefs" for each small group of 3-5 children.

Thank you to each of the volunteers (who are too numerous to all be mentioned) for making VBS a wonderful experience for our children! Because of the tremendous support from the congregation, we were able to nurture not only our own children, but also to have a significant outreach to families in our community.



# VBS supports Inland Valley Hope Partners

Forty children and their parents donated nearly \$450 worth of school supplies during Vacation Bible School (VBS) this summer. Our special project for VBS came out of Inland Valley Hope Partners' call for help in collecting donations for the kids and family members of the shelters who will be going back to school this Fall with little or no ability to get school supplies.
