Enneagram: A Journey of Self-Discovery

Mark your calendars for our Fall retreat on November 1 & 2. In this exploration of the Enneagram, we will discover a profound, elegant and compassionate map of the human psyche including both psychological and spiritual components. Put all this together and this will be our guide toward self-understanding and self-development.

The goal? Self understanding. As a further benefit, a peek into the motivations and inner workings of others in our lives, to increase understanding and improve relationships.

By gaining insight into our personal world view, we gain deeper understanding of ourselves and others. Values, habits and motivations will be explored – and healthy, presence based alternatives discovered. Lecture, discussion and interactive exercises. All levels of Enneagram knowledge welcome.

NESSL Establishes Schools for Syrian Refugees

Tens of thousands of children are suffering the horrible effects of civil war in Syria. The conflict, now 9 years forward, has displaced millions of children and families in the worst migration crisis of our lifetime. School age children from Syria living as refugees in Lebanon now number some 400,000. Each year, another 40,000 newborns add to that refugee population. It is difficult to imagine all the needs and desires of daily life that go unmet. Basic needs of food, clothing, hygiene, safety and security. The desire for recreation, coveted friendships, psychological healing and decent healthcare are often beyond reach in refugee villages. This staggering crisis results in extreme hardships for both the migrants and their hosts.

In Lebanon, home to 1.5 million Syrian refugees, government and volunteer resources are stretched thin. It has fallen upon non-profit organizations to provide many of the needs of refugees. The churches have taken on an important role in caring for many of those people with dire needs.

The National Evangelical Synod of Syria and Lebanon (NESSL), is working diligently to supply many basic needs, especially in the wintertime when warm clothing, fuel for heating and warmer shelter are key to survival. In 2016, NESSL addressed the need for education among the children living in refugee villages. Many of those children had never attended school. A network of "Educational Centers" (schools) were established by NESSL in 2016 to provide elementary education for up to 200 students at five sites near refugee villages in Lebanon. These schools were funded by churches and individuals throughout the Middle East and around the world. After nearly three years of supporting these facilities, NESSL is renewing their campaign to support this education initiative into the coming year(s).

There are now four sites in Lebanon where classes have begun this school year. They are in **Kab Elias** (in the Bekka Valley), **Tripoli and Minyara** (in the North), and **Tyre** (in the South). The curriculum includes Math, Arabic, English, Science and Christian Ethics. Students are also provided with one daily light meal, some clothing, transportation, school supplies and accident insurance. It is anticipated that 50 students will be accepted to study at each site for this school year.

Reverend Joseph Kassab, General Secretary of NESSL writes: "This ministry is very crucial to the future of those refugee children and to the Lebanese Society as well. The mere watching of those children outside schools without education is a crime preparing for crimes. Tens of

thousands of children in the streets doing nothing will certainly expose them to many dangers, namely crimes, fanaticism and abuse. We are urged by the call of Jesus not to prevent those little ones from tasting the Kingdom of God, and what it means to their situation."

"I came that they may have life, and may have it abundantly." John 10:10

The NESSL is appealing to their partners around the world to join in this important initiative. Continuing our congregation's long history and tradition of supporting Christian churches and other initiatives in the Middle East region, your Mission Commission and Refugee Concerns Team have both designated funding support for these Education Centers. You will hear more about this story as the Refugee Concerns Team (RCT) seeks to update us on the progress of this educational program. The RCT appeals to our congregation to contribute generously to this project through a special offering approved by Session, to be taken in mid-October. With winter approaching and school now in full swing, the need for funding is great. We thank you for your caring of our sisters and brothers in Christ in the Middle East region, and for the displaced children who need our love and attention as they grow in God's image.
