### From the Pastor

All The Earth Is Waiting

Waiting, expecting, preparing, watching--all these are words used to describe what we do during the season of Advent. We turn our eyes from the consumer driven frenzy of "the holidays" and train our vision instead on the slow unfolding of God's promises within us, among us, and around us.

There is so much we are waiting for, watching for: signs of peace where there is violence, signs of hope where there is despair, signs that mercy is blooming in fields where hate and resentment have grown for years. This process of waiting and watching transforms us. As poet Mary Oliver has written, "We become what we pay attention to." As we wait and watch for signs of God's promises unfolding we become part of those promises: part of the hope, peace, joy, and love that is coming to the world with the coming of Christ.

The theme for our Advent worship, preaching and devotions this year is "All the Earth is Waiting." We wait and watch, not just as private individuals, but as part of the whole grand cosmos, waiting and watching for the promises of God to unfold. As we watch for God's promises, we become bearers of the promises.

Spanish poet and musician Alberto Taule expressed our hope in his Advent hymn:

All the earth is waiting for the Savior He comes to bring us the truth He comes sowing seeds of love through the world For all the poor, his arms hold salvation.

Toda la tierra espera al Salvador Viene a traer a los hombres la verdad A sembrar por el mundo semillas de amor A todos los pobres su brazo salvara.

### Dos & Don'ts When Speaking With a Young Adult

As is a truth throughout generations of young adults, this moment in their lives is a time of life-altering transition and self-discovery. After only 18-20 years of lived experience they are expected to know how they want to spend the next 60 years of their lives. The gravity of this is not lost on them and, in fact, to them it poses some of their biggest frustrations and struggles.

At the end of a three-week series on launching into adulthood, the CPC young adults, along with Pastor Brian, worked diligently to come up with a **list of dos and don'ts they hoped will be helpful to guide others in how to** engage a young adult in conversation.

This list was formed out of a deep appreciation each of them has for the parents and adults in their lives. They strive to find balance between the care others desire to show them and the great expectations that have been driven into the way they navigate the world around them.

Their hope and prayer is that this list becomes a gift in opening and nurturing healthy and helpful conversation that is longed for by both young adults and the adults in their lives.

- 1. Don't ask me about my X-Year-Plan. I may not be ready to share.
- 2. Ask me if I'm enjoying or have enjoyed something I'm involved in, or how I would like to have seen it played out differently.
- 3. Share with me how you feel about things you've done in your past.
- 4. **Don't give me a vague Aesop fable, give me specifics and explain your** reasoning (i.e. a lesson thinly masked in a story sounds inauthentic).
- 5. Understand that my problems may be different than yours and there may not be a solution; simply listening is helpful.
- 6. When it comes to money, don't tell me what I should have done; rather, explain what I can do to work towards correcting it.
- Understand when I speak honestly I am being vulnerable and appreciate that in that moment I'm listening to everything you say and feeling everything you aren't saying.
- 8. Your stories of failure are sometimes more helpful than your stories of success; tell me how you moved forward through the failure.

## Magnificat!

On Sunday, December 15, our Sanctuary Choir will present *Magnificat!*, by Mark Hayes. When setting out to write a new work **based on this ancient text, Hayes writes, "I** was struck with the unrestrained, yet quiet joy that Mary expressed to God. I knew that I wanted to compose a work that expressed that same joy. I humbly offer my setting with the hope that it will inspire you and bring joy **to your heart."** 

### Shoes that Fit

In the summer, I requested funds for a back-to-school initiative for refugees who have resettled in our area. Most are no longer on refugee visas, but classified as immigrants, like me. However, my family has had thirty years to get established in the States, and these families struggle to make ends meet. The last of the shoes were delivered on November 2nd, at a Family Fall Festival sponsored by NAC (Newcomers Access Center) which has an office at First Presbyterian Pomona. I am pleased to report that deacons funded twenty (20) pairs of shoes for refugees from Iraq, Afghanistan and Syria. NAC provided a list of names and coordinated the drop-offs. In all, over sixty children from eighteen refugee and immigrant families received school supplies and shoes!

This donation from the deacons meant that every kid in a family received shoes, young adults and school aged children, eliminating decisions about which person would be on or off the list. Moreover, we distributed the shoes through a local non-profit organization called Shoes That Fit. They distribute quality, brand-name shoes nationwide and were able to provide the shoes at a discount, stretching our donation dollars even further!

This is my gospel fed dream: "I was a stranger and you welcomed me." Matthew 25:31-46.

### Adopt a Family Follow-up


