From the Pastor

2020 Vision for Lent


During 2020, we are thinking about vision and considering how the world looks when we look at it through different lenses in our sacred scriptures. For the Sundays of Lent, we will consider what we see when we look at life through the "I Am" sayings in the Gospel of John.

I am the Bread of Life, I am the Vine and you are the branches, I am The Good Shepherd, I Am the Light of the World, I am the Way, I am the Resurrection.

When Moses first encountered God in the burning bush, he asked to know God's name. God responded, "I Am." In John's gospel, Jesus echoes this response in talking about himself and his mission on earth. Jesus uses well known symbols from the Hebrew scriptures: bread, water, light, vines, paths, shepherd, and life to reveal the way in which he embodies and reveals the work of God in the world. In using these symbols, he also invites his followers to join him in the mission of embodying and revealing the work of God. When we deeply consider the "I Am" sayings of Jesus we learn more, not only about who Jesus is, but also about who we are called to become as Christ's body, the church.

In our church's sanctuary, the "I Am" statements of Jesus are depicted in one of the stained glass windows, giving us visual icons for contemplating those statements as well. Throughout the season, we will be creating art for worship that reflects our exploration of these sayings.

One Great Hour of Sharing

The Reverend Erin K. Swenson, Th.M., Ph.D., was ordained as Eric Karl Swenson in 1973 by the Presbytery of Atlanta, Twenty-three years later in 1996, after completing a gender transition from male to female, that ordination was upheld by the Presbytery of Greater Atlanta, PCUSA, making Erin the

first known mainstream minister to transition from male to female while remaining in ordained office.

Erin continues to practice active ministry as a psychotherapist/ marriage and family therapist. She travels nationally and internationally presenting to conferences, churches, organizations, seminaries, and universities.


Volunteers Needed
