This prayer, delivered by Brad Smith, then a seminary intern serving at Spring Valley Presbyterian Church in Columbia, SC, gave birth to an idea. Why not use Super Bowl weekend, a time when people come together for football and fun, to also unify the nation for a higher good: collecting dollars and canned food for the needy? Youth could collect donations at their schools and churches in soup pots, and then send every dollar directly to a local charity of their choice.

Your CPC youth will be collecting donations following worship on Sunday, February 3. All funds collected will be used to help alleviate hunger in our community.

#### **Oakmont Funding**

Por many years CPC Deacons have supported Oakmont Elementary School in a variety of ways, as a part of the Presbyterian Church's commitment to public education. According to Principal Jenny Adams, the greatest current need this year is funding toward the field study trips each class takes. More than half of the students who attend Oakmont are from low income families, so funding these trips is a challenge.

In 2009 the school became Oakmont Outdoor School, with a focus on studying the

different biomes of our world. Each grade level studies one of the Biomes (Forest, Arctic/Antarctic, grassland, desert, marine and shrubland) with outdoor experiences, culminating in field study trips from one to four days.

The Deacons hope you will support their efforts with a donation to the Deacons' Fund, marked Oakmont and place it in the offering plate, turn it in or mail to the office, or give to a Deacon after church, beginning February 10.

#### **Moment For Mission**

Claremont Presbyterian Church contributes to the Presbyterian World Mission. As part of this ministry we have supported Elmarie and Scott Parker. Elmarie works as a regional liaison for Syria, Lebanon and Iraq, and Scott works as an associate for ecumenical partnerships. They share about their work experiences through Mission Connections at <a href="mailto:pcusa.org/missionconnections">pcusa.org/missionconnections</a>, and we are providing a brief summary of those experiences.

They trained teachers from the church in Iraq on a deeper understanding of autism and on methods of working more effectively with the students and their families. The faculty of the Near East School of Theology based in Beirut, Lebanon, and Presbyterian World Mission organized a visiting team from the Presbyterian Church USA and the United Church of England who met with members of the Assyrian, Syriac Orthodox, Maronite Catholic, Armenian Orthodox, Greek Orthodox, Greek Catholic, Armenian Protestant, and Presbyterian Churches. They also visited with Muslim leaders from Sunni, Shi'a and Druze communities.


They shared about three organizations that were founded by Christians and Muslims: The Lebanese Organization for Study and Training invites people from different religious backgrounds to engage in civic issues. The

Forum for Development, Culture and Dialogue is working in Syria using art therapy with children, and working toward reconciliation between opposition groups and the government, as well as working for religious freedom. The Adyan Foundation works in Lebanon to help people understand shared social responsibility and citizenship in order to move away from the language of "majority" and "minority".

Elmarie Parker hopes that the joyful commitments of these dedicated people, in the face of many challenges, will help us look with fresh eyes at our own context and ask ourselves "How might God be calling us to be bridge-builders, reconcilers, and conveners of a safe place for those holding different opinions, committed to finding solutions that improve the opportunities of everyone in our various communities."

# CPC Reaches out to Refugee Families over the Holidays

Once again, Claremont Presbyterian reached out to support refugee families resettling in our area.

**Turkey Distributions**. Many thanks to Supervisor Hilda Solis who offered 15 Thanksgiving turkeys to the Claremont Presbyterian Church. Karen notified me of the donation. Brian picked them up and stuffed the kitchen freezer. Brenda Hill and I handed out 11 turkeys to families. Some Syrian ladies had never roasted a turkey before and were thrilled to participate in this American tradition.

Christmas gift card donations: We are excited to share that 30 children of refugee families received \$20 Target gift cards for Christmas. None of the parents celebrate Christmas but they were all touched by our congregation's generosity towards their children.

Sad News: I am very sad to report that the Harfoush family lost their beautiful eighteen year old girl on Christmas Day. She died from complications of septic shock due to a kidney infection, however the coroner listed her death as homicide because she had been shot in the back by a sniper in Syria when she was twelve. The bullet snipped her spinal cord, she was a paraplegic for years, but the family had precious time in the presence of a beautiful person before that final medical complication.


Her memory is cherished.

I am so proud of the way Claremont rallied around this family. Claremont Presbyterian Church was the fiscal sponsor for RRT2, a grass roots movement that called itself Refugee Resettlement Team Two. RRT2 volunteers met the Harfoush family at the airport two years ago and focused on helping them. Claremont Presbyterian Church collected enough money to supplement half rent for over a year. A home of their own and stability helped the family relax for the first time in five years. RRT2 provided assistance for medical appointments, educational support and helped them develop friendships in the community. CPC even offered it's tablecloths for the tables at Nadia Harfoush's funeral.

I am part of the Refugee Concerns Team at our church. This group assists local refugees, asylum seekers and church communities in the Middle East. Our work continues with grit and grace. If you have ideas or questions about this for the group, drop me a line judy.kohnen@gmail.com.
