From the Pastor

Our worship service on January 7 will include an opportunity for you to come forward and receive prayer to sustain you on your journey through 2018. We have done this on the first Sunday of the new year for several years now, and many people have shared with me how meaningful this service is.

Others, though, have shared that they rarely come forward because, in the moment, they cannot think of what they would pray for or about. As you consider what you would pray for yourself and others as the new year begins, here are some questions for reflection and contemplation that may bring your deepest hopes and fears closer to the surface.

What was your greatest joy this past year?

What made you the angriest?

Who came into your life unexpectedly?

What was the biggest surprise?

Where did you encounter the holy in an unexpected way?

What is the biggest change you would like to see in yourself in 2018?

What would you do in 2018 if you knew you weren't afraid?

What question would you most like answered in 2018?

What thresholds will you cross in 2018?

What change do you want to lead this year?

Whose suffering do you want to ease this year?

What do you want to create this year?

Who do you want to create it with?

As you reflect on these questions, pay attention to what it might prompt you to pray about.

Associate Pastor Nominating Committee Update

The Associate Pastor Nominating Committee (APNC) has been meeting weekly since mid-July to search for a candidate for an Associate Pastor for Outreach (ordained) or a Director of Outreach (non-ordained.) The committee has completed its review of Personal Information Forms and resumes of more than 50 candidates and has selected a handful of finalists.

Starting in early January, committee

members plan to interview finalists by phone/video call. The top candidates from those interviews will be invited to Claremont for an in-person interview and tour of our town and church campus.

Once the committee has made its selection, the candidate will be invited to CPC as a guest preacher and the congregation will vote on whether to call the candidate!

We are excited to be moving toward this phase of our search process.

Stewardship 2018 - Let's Run with It!


Ver the last few Sunday services during the Stewardship Moment we've heard from several members of the community that are not members of this church. They have explained to us how important CPC is to fulfilling their mission for educating children, supporting refugee families, or reaching out to new people who seek spiritual community. Through their words we have had a glimpse of what the world would look like without our church and without the people in this congregation.

Our vision for CPC is one of "Giving" by embracing more outreach to the community, by offering CPC as a platform to others for new mission initiatives and services, and by doing all of that better. We are running with this vision that requires resources, especially with the addition to our staff of an Associate Pastor of Outreach. To date, in support of that vision, we have received pledges of \$427,000 toward a goal of \$510,000 and this is a wonderful sign of the generosity of this congregation. We will continue to receive into January 2018 before we set our budget for 2018. Checks that are placed in the offering plate on January 7, 2018 will not qualify for a charitable contribution in 2017 even if the check is predated to 2017 or was actually written in 2017.
