#### From the Pastor

Some of us begin the new year with resolutions: things we want to achieve or change during the coming twelve months. In the lectionary for one of the first Sundays in the new year we have the story of the Baptism of Jesus, which is also a story of committing to a new way of life, a new set of priorities and a new community.

This month, on Sunday January 13, we will hear again in worship the story of Jesus' baptism by John in the river Jordan. We will also celebrate as a community some of the new commitments and opportunities our congregation is embracing for this new year.

We are reaching out to the parents and staff of the Claremont Presbyterian Children's Center with Coffee and Donuts every Friday as the school day begins. Pastor Brian and volunteers from the church greet parents and students as they arrive and build new friendship, relationships, and connections between CPCC families and the church.

We continue to expand worship beyond 10:00 a.m. on Sunday morning with Jazz Vespers, Evening Prayer for Healing and Wholeness and Thursday morning meditation.

We are working with a school in Tijuana to bring our Living Waters for the World clean water installations to a new site in addition to the sites we work with in Peru.

We celebrate Lemonade Wednesdays each week as Pastor Brian greets Mountain View Elementary students and families as they leave school for the day and congregate on our church's front lawn and patio.

We are reaching out to embrace Mountain View staff and faculty with caring appreciation: small "thank you" gifts at Halloween and Christmas.

These new initiatives also offer YOU an opportunity to be part of all the ways that our congregation is reaching out to our community in new ways. There will be a time to consider how you may be called to new commitments with us as the year begins.

It's an exciting time and place to be living and sharing the good news.



### Moment For Mission: David Cortes-Fuentes and Josey Saez-Acevedo— Mission Co-Workers in Cuba

Claremont Presbyterian Church contributes to the Presbyterian World Mission, whose ministries focus on alleviating poverty, sharing the good news of God's love in Jesus Christ, and working for reconciliation. Two of the Mission Co-workers we support are David Cortes-Fuentes and Josey Saez-Acevedo, who are in their third year working at the Evangelical Seminary of Theology in Matanzas, Cuba. David and Josey were previously active members of our church, including Josey working as our Director of Family Ministry and David teaching some very informative Adult Sunday classes about the Gospels and Galatians.

In November they sent a Mission Connections newsletter telling us that currently seven of those residential students at the seminary are preparing for ministry in the Reformed Presbyterian Church in Cuba. Two are in their third year, three are in their second year and two are in their first year. These students also have church leadership responsibilities every weekend at various ministry assignments for six months. This provides them with a wide variety of training and experiences. The students share their field experiences so that the ministry experiences

provide an opportunity to be both learners and teachers.

David and Josey report this creates a real partnership in which they as members and leaders of the PC(USA) are blessed by our partners in Cuba and are a blessing to the Church in Cuba and the seminary in Matanzas. They have come to know about the sacrifices and dedication of hundreds of brothers and sisters in local churches serving the Lord and helping the community fight the root causes of poverty, creating opportunities for reconciliation and peace by breaking the cycles of violence, and empowering the Church to witness to their faith even in the difficult times and with very few resources.


