### From the Pastor

We call it "People's Choice": twelve weeks of worship gatherings in the summer months chosen entirely by "the people," that is, the worshiping congregation (you'll excuse the false dichotomy between "people" and . . . someone else?)

Choice: the word has me thinking in these first days of summer.

We are a people gripped by a story not of our own making, and it's not the story anybody would choose given the choice. In our story, glory comes through service, not conquest. The last are first. The poor are made rich, captives are released, and the kingdom of God draws near. And this story shows God choosing us for this story, choosing the least likely and the least fit, before we know the first thing about it.

Still, we have to make choices, and the littlest ones may have the greatest impact. Will I hand the dollar in my pocket to the person right in front of me who's asking for it? Will I hold my tongue in this moment when I'm really angry? Will I try this thing with an uncertain outcome, though it may fail? And in this technological age, the choices only seem to multiply.

My prayer for us these summer weeks is that we will have the confidence of a people chosen by God as we grapple with all the choices we must make. And, should we fear, may God shape us ever more into the people God desires us to be, the very people God has chosen and called to tell the gospel story in word and deed right now, right here.


## Sabbatical Blog

## Help with Community Meal on July 27

Our church is one of seven congregations involved in serving meals three Sundays a month on a rotating basis: Claremont United Church of Christ, Friends Meeting (Quakers), Our Lady of the Assumption Catholic Church, Good Shepherd Lutheran Church, Claremont United Methodist Church, Monte Vista Unitarian-Universalist and Nithyananda V. Temple, Montclair.

As you may remember, this meal program is the response to discussions more than three years ago led by members of the Interfaith Council on the question: "What can local faith communities do to address the needs of the 'homeless' (or financially challenged) in our midst?"

It's now our turn again on **Sunday**, **July 27**. On that date, volunteers are needed to (1) prepare a food item for 20 people and bring it to Sumner School by 2:45 p.m. that day or (2) help serve the meal, visit with participants and prepare "to go" boxes.

## **Summer Surprise June 22 - August 10**

Each summer we take a break from our primary children's curriculum, *Godly Play*, to focus our attention in a different way. We call our eightweek summer series Summer Surprise! Because we understand that most families need more flexibility in the summer, we design and select curriculum for Summer Surprise that complements our Godly Play curriculum, but one in which each Sunday is a complete lesson. Our hope is that children can find enrichment if they come to all eight weeks in the series, or if they just come to one.

This summer we are learning about stories of children in the Bible including Miriam, young Jeremiah, and twelve-year old Jesus. Our hope is that through the stories and activities the children will connect their stories to the stories of the children in both the Old and New Testament. We expect that through this identification our children's faith will be enriched. This year, Summer Surprise will run eight consecutive Sundays from June 22-August 10. We meet during worship following "The Time with the Children," and children


entering kindergarten - grade 5 are welcome to come and learn.

The center will receive a portion of the proceeds and you will enjoy a delicious Mexican meal. If you prefer to eat at home you may get your food to go. Thank you for your support!




## **Seeking Nursery Director**

We did! The CPC Personnel Committee adopted a sabbatical policy for pastors in 2013. In 2014, the congregation voted at its annual meeting to grant Pastor Karen a two month sabbatical as part of her terms of call for this year. Karen also received approval from San Gabriel Presbytery to do ministry with the congregation in Mexico during her stay there.

#### Can we be in touch?

While away, Karen will occasionally post news from her sabbatical on the church Facebook page or website. (See the front page for more info about her blog.) The church staff know how to reach her if there is an emergency or information that cannot wait until her return. However, she will not be checking her church email or voicemail.

#### What's in it for us?
