Good News from the Associate Pastor Nominating Committee

Pastor Nominating Committee has unanimously and enthusiastically extended a call to the Rev. Brian S. Gaeta-Symonds. And he has accepted!

The APNC believes that Brian is a great fit for CPC. By now you should have received a mailing telling you all about Brian. You can also find information on the church website www.claremontpres.org.

Now we need your help with next steps. Please put these two important dates on your calendar:

On Saturday, July 21, from 2:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m. in Fellowship Hall, the APNC will host a reception for Brian and his family so that you may get acquainted with them; and

On Sunday, July 22, Brian will preach and lead worship at CPC. Immediately following worship, the Session will call a congregational meeting to vote on approving Brian's call and its terms. Please be present!

If approved by the congregation, Brian will start work at CPC on September 1. He would also be available during August for meetings with church leadership to help plan our fall program.

I would like to personally thank the hard-working and faithful members of the APNC: Jenny Eazell, Karee Galloway, Stuart Lillich, Tom Luschei, Scott Randles, Alejandro Salas, and Rita Watts, as well as presbytery liaison Sonnie Swenston. During the past 12 months, we met more than 30 times, reviewed more than 120 resumes and conducted eight interviews. The work of the APNC also stands on the shoulders of the foundations laid by our New Beginnings initiative and the Staffing Strategy Task Force.

I also would like to thank Pastor Karen and all church members for their prayers and support for our committee.

I hope to see you on July 21 for Brian's reception and on July 22 for worship and the congregational meeting!




Summer Communicator
