

For the last several summers, Claremont Presbyterian Church has offered a "People's Choice" sermon series. Our pastors invited church members to submit questions or topics for them to address in their sermons during the months of July and August.

Topics included:

Is Heaven Real? What about Hell?
What's Up with the Trinity?
Does God Have a Sense of Humor?
Can Christians Argue with the Bible?
Can Christians and Atheists Have Real Conversations?

This summer, we want to take this concept to the next level with a series called "Community Questions." We want to extend an open invitation for anyone from Claremont to suggest a question, scripture text or current issue as a possible sermon topic. If you are a regular participant here at Claremont Presbyterian Church, I hope you will help by extending this invitation to the community beyond the church walls. Ask your friends, neighbors, co-workers, or extended family: If you could ask a pastor one question, what would it be?

Here's how it works:

Community members should suggest a question, text or issue by June 10 by emailing Pastor Karen Sapio at karensapio@claremontpres.org.

If your topic is chosen for the series, one of our pastors will contact you to schedule a Sunday between July 2 and September 3 to feature your question. They will also want to meet with you at least once to hear more of your story and learn why this question is important to you.

On the Sunday that your question is featured, we hope you can join us for worship.

Pentecost Offering: Investing in Our Greatest Resource



The Pentecost Offering is traditionally received on the Day of Pentecost which is **June 4** this year. A gift to the Pentecost Offering helps the church encourage, develop, and support its young people, and also address the needs of at-risk children. 40% of the Pentecost offering is retained by CPC to make an impact in the lives of young people within our own community and is administered by our Christian Education and Leadership Commission.

25% supports Young Adult Volunteers (YAV) which provides opportunities for young adults to serve in communities around the world

and grow as leaders through transformative Christian service.

25% goes to Ministries with Youth to help guide our youth by uniting them to Christ and lifting them up as leaders and messengers of God's word.

The final 10% is used to advocate for atrisk children, supporting vital ministries helping improve education and provide safe havens for children.

description for the position and another to work on a plan for sustaining such a position financially. Both working groups will have reported to the May Session meeting by the time you read this. Look for another update later in June.

Vacation Bible School Is Coming! June 26-29, 5:30 - 8:00 p.m.

Water All Around the World, a curriculum from Living Waters for the World, will be the basis for our Vacation Bible School this year. We're excited about the possibilities for linking CPC's mission work with Living Waters with our children's VBS experience. Each day will include a presentation on a different country where Living Waters for the World is active. These presentations will be combined with daily Bible, crafts and other activities also linked to water.

We hope that you'll share the news about VBS with your families, friends and neighbors. All children ages 3 through entering 5th graders are welcome as participants. Youth grades six and above are encouraged to sign up as volunteers. There will be signups on the patio after church both for participants and volunteers during the month of June and registration forms are also available in the church office.

Are you interested in volunteering? Volunteers are needed as teachers, craft leaders, cooks and registration help. In addition, a presenter who is from, or has knowledge of, one of the following countries is needed for one day only: Peru, Mexico, Haiti, Cuba, Ghana or Honduras.

We hope that you, your children, grandchildren, friends and neighbors will be able to join us for VBS!




