Summer Sermon Series: The Gospel According to...

Tictorian poet Gerard Manley Hopkins once wrote:

Christ plays in ten thousand places, Lovely in limbs, and lovely in eyes not his...

The poem speaks of how Christ reveals himself throughout creation and human culture – in unexpected places and even through those who have no idea that they are bearing the imprint of Christ into the world.

In the last several decades, a number of writers have taken up this idea. When I was a kid in the 1970s, my parents had a copy of *The Gospel According to Peanuts* on the bookshelf in our living room. In that book, Presbyterian minister Robert Short used the popular comic strip and its characters to lift up important themes from the gospel and to offer wisdom about living a life of faith. Since then, dozens of "The Gospel According to..." books have appeared. A short list includes, *The Gospel According to Disney, The Gospel According to Harry Potter, The Gospel According to Disney, The Gospel According to Starbucks, and The Gospel According to Winnie the Pooh.*

This year our annual summer "People's Choice" sermon series will celebrate YOUR favorite picks for popular culture icons that have inspired you and taught you something about the great themes of the gospel: hope, grace, forgiveness, redemption, justice, and the power of love over death and evil. Who or What is your pick for "The Gospel According to...?"

Bag-It Sunday – June 10

ne of the many ways CPC assists the needy through the Inland Valley Hope Partners is Bag-It Sunday. After church on June 10 we will assemble hygiene kits for the homeless. As we fill each bag, we visit with one another, and appreciate having the basic necessities ourselves. Start collecting hygiene supplies now, bring them to church the week before (June 3) and plan to join us after church on June 10 to participate in this meaningful outreach to those in need.

Ways you can help include:

- Saving individual-sized hygiene articles as you travel or purchase them from the following list.
- ♦ Shopping for individual-sized hygiene supplies, such as soap, washcloths, shampoo, toothbrushes, toothpaste, socks (women's and men's), deodorant, razers, shaving cream, combs, anti-bacterial lotion (not gel), lip balm, sunblock, and snack packs like nuts, dried fruits, energy bars.
- Bringing items to CPC before June 3 so the Deacons can purchase what is needed.
- Making a monetary donation so the Deacons can purchase needed items – place in the offering plate, marked Bag-It, find the Deacons on the patio after church May 20 – June 3, or mail checks to the church, with the designation "Bag-It Sunday" in the memo.
- Joining us to assemble the hygiene kits after church on June 10.

Wrap the day up with a worship concert featuring NAK and the Fictitious Professor. Their music will bring to form the essence of Dr. Waetjen's teaching.

The seminar will take place from 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. and will include continental breakfast, lunch, and a cake to celebrate Dr. Waetjen's 89th birthday!




Jesus went to the desert to pray, and for centuries believers and non-believers alike have sought calm and quiet to listen to the Holy Spirit.

All are welcome. You don't have to be a CPC member or regularly practice any religion to participate.






Graduate Recognition
