


Each of these mission programs accomplishes important work that no congregation can fulfill on its own. And in times of great need, these works are needed more than ever.

Join us April 1 for an early morning "service" on Easter...an Easter service project, that is. CPC will again prepare, serve and enjoy Easter breakfast with the guests and staff at Crossroads women's shelter. You can be a part of this Easter opportunity in several different ways: by helping with planning, by preparing food ahead of time, by providing flowers or table decorations, and/or by serving breakfast on Easter morning. All volunteers will be back in time for the 10:00 a.m. service at CPC, so please contact the church office if you'd like to join us.

Crossroads in one of CPC's many mission partners. Since 1974, the mission of Crossroads is to provide housing, education, support, counseling, and employment training in a homelike environment for women who have been incarcerated. The primary goal is to empower women with new skills to help them step out of the revolving door of prison and move towards economic self-sufficiency. Throughout the United States, 59% of women released from prison return to prison within three years. In contrast, 86% of Crossroads graduates are self-sustaining after six years!

Capital Campaign Completion

early three years ago, after two years of planning, Claremont Presbyterian Church embarked upon its 60th Anniversary Capital Campaign. Our goal was to equip our congregation for new beginnings in ministry and community service in the decades to come. We set a financial target of \$600,000 to support these efforts.

As of December 31, 2017, the following have been received and expended:

Income

Total pledged and non-pledged gifts \$636,017.35

Expenditures

Total expenditures to date * \$623,666.61

* Includes Ministry and Mission funds not yet granted. Remaining funds will be used to complete a few outstanding Capital Campaign projects.

God has blessed us through your generosity in making this possible. Worship flows with the music of our renovated pipe organ, children gather for Godly Play in our remodeled chapel, learning and collaboration are happening in updated classroom spaces, our water-wise landscape adds beauty to the northeast corner of our campus, and every day our new solar panels collect energy from our abundant California sunshine. Our fund for New Initiatives in Ministry and Mission is already at work in new outreach efforts such as Jazz Vespers and community service to refugees from Syria.

We are full of joy and gratitude that we have achieved the goals we set forth for this campaign. As we completed these renovations, we discovered other ways in which our campus needs to be repaired, maintained and upgraded in order for it to be safe and fully functional. As we move forward, you will hear more about opportunities for contributing to further efforts to make this possible.

In concluding the Capital Campaign and its projects, we share these words from Paul the Apostle: I thank my God every time I remember you, constantly praying with joy in every one of my prayers for all of you, because of your sharing in the gospel from the first day until now. I am confident of this, that the one who began a good work among you will bring it to completion by the day of Jesus Christ.


The Latest
