

From Temporary Associate Pastor, Krista Wuertz

Dear Friends,

I have known many of you since I started my ministry at Claremont Presbyterian Church and my doctoral studies at the Claremont School of Theology about seven years ago. This May, I am completing both my time with you at CPC, and also my doctoral program in Practical Theology at CST. I recently defended my dissertation entitled, "Building Resilience through Relational Practices: Imagining Intentional Christian Community for Returning Citizens in an Age of Mass Incarceration," and so I will graduate from my doctoral program in mid May. I look forward to the opportunity to share my dissertation with you during the Adult Education hour on May 14.

I am thankful for all of the life events and changes that I have had the opportunity to share with this congregation and community. Four years ago, you helped Ann and me welcome our twins into our family, and more recently you have been a part of my transition into ordained ministry.

Since I have completed the doctoral program that brought me to Claremont, our family is hoping to relocate in the next year. We are attentively listening to where God is calling me into ministry, and we are all appreciative of the opportunities for ministry that you offered over the past seven years. This community provided my children with their first sense of Christian community, and me with my first experience of ordained ministry. You have all been a part of helping us to listen and discern God's call in and on our lives, and for this we are forever grateful.

I will be happy to share more about our plans in personal conversations as we say our goodbyes together throughout this next month.

Church Staffing Update

Our church's Personnel Committee has recently recommended and our Session has approved several actions regarding our staff here at Claremont Presbyterian Church.

Interim Associate Pastor Krista Wuertz's twelve month term of call concludes on May 1. In consultation with Session, this has been extended through June 1 in order to conclude the Sunday School year. On May 28, Pastor Krista will preach her final sermon for us and we will celebrate her ministry here. We wish Krista, Ann, Rylan and Aidan the very best as they move toward new horizons. Session is working to ensure that there is staff and volunteer coverage for Summer Sunday School and Vacation Bible School in the months ahead.

Session has extended Parish Associate Dongwoo Lee's contract for an additional six months, through the end of October. During this time he will continue to work with our Adult Education ministry and our collaborations with our on-campus ministry partnerships as well as working to improve and extend our on-line communications and social media profile.

The Personnel Committee has asked Pastor Karen to recruit additional temporary staff as needed to support our ministries while the search for permanent pastoral staff is going on.

At its March meeting, Session received the report of our Staffing Strategy Team who sent representatives to give this report in person and answer questions. Copies of their report are available in the church office. Session agreed to take action on this report at their April 26 meeting. There will be an update during worship on May 7 to let the congregation know what action has been taken, and more information will be distributed in the June edition of the Communicator.

What is most important is that, even during this time of discernment and transition, our congregation has been moving forward in ministry and in new ways of reaching out to our community.

5:30 - 9:00 a.m. - Set up trash boxes, snack area, set up barricades, help vendors unload and set up their spaces, keep the public out before the sale starts.

8:00 a.m. - 1:00 p.m. - Help at yard sale - help buyers load their purchases into their cars, distribute snacks, collect trash bags from vendors and take to the dumpster, monitor entrance and loading areas.

12:00 p.m. - 3:30 p.m. - Clean up, pick up trash, help vendors and buyers load their vehicles and take unsold items to the donation truck that will be on the grounds.

The church Facebook page has an Email Signup App. You may also contact Jo Colclough in the church office at jcolclough@claremontpres.org and tell her you would like to subscribe.




CPCC Fundraiser
