In addition to these new offerings, we continue our regular Jazz Vespers Services.



# Bag-It Sunday - June 10

ne of the many ways CPC assists the needy through the Inland Valley Hope Partners is Bag-It Sunday. After church on June 10 we will assemble hygiene kits for the homeless. As we fill each bag, we visit with one another, and appreciate having the basic necessities ourselves. Start collecting hygiene supplies now, bring them to church the week before (June 3) and plan to join us after church on June 10 to participate in this meaningful outreach to those in need.

Ways you can help include:

- Saving individual-sized hygiene articles as you travel or purchase them from the following list.
- Shopping for individual-sized hygiene supplies, such as soap, washcloths,

- shampoo, toothbrushes, toothpaste, socks (women's and men's), deodorant, razers, shaving cream, combs, anti-bacterial lotion (not gel), lip balm, sunblock, and snack packs like nuts, dried fruits, energy bars.
- Bringing items to CPC before June 3 so the Deacons can purchase what is needed.
- Making a monetary donation so the Deacons can purchase needed items – place in the offering plate, marked Bag-It, find the Deacons on the patio after church May 20 – June 3, or mail checks to the church, with the designation "Bag-It Sunday" in the memo.
- Joining us to assemble the hygiene kits after church on June 10.

# **Living Waters for the World Trip to Peru**

Last August the San Gabriel and Riverside Presbyteries sent a group of youth to Urubamba, a rural town about an hour from Cusco, Peru. In addition to sightseeing, our youth visited a boy's home, helped make mud bricks, set-up crafts and performed a few plays. The activities were from the Living Waters for the World (LWW) Vacation Bible School curriculum. The boy's home had a LWW water system, even though our San Gabriel group did not install that particular water purification system, we were able to build community, teach health education and create a cooperative, long term relationship by spending time with them.

The week of May 27 to June 2, we are sending another Living Waters team to Lima. The new site has been sponsored by a Rotary International grant. Rotary clubs raised funds for five new water purification systems in Lima. They asked various LWW teams to do the installation work. Our proposed site is San Mateo School, located in a suburb, San Juan de Lurigancho. The 101 team organizing logistics is Cyndie Crowell, Wendy Gist and Octavio Guerrero. The 102 team, in charge of health education, is Irene Atwood and Pat Martinez-Miller. Rob Crowell and Will Kohnen are the 103 team; they do the actual system installation with Octavio helping with translation. Rev. Twining Campbell and Don Maddox will also be joining on this trip to assist all teams as needed. The group also scopes out new locations and visits existing installations.

Under the direction of the 101 and 103 teams, the school has prepared a tiled room with electricity, plumbing to dispense water, a sink and a tank that holds purified water on the rooftop. Several months ago, Roger Denton got together with Octavio and Will to work on the floor plan, after Rob and Octavio checked on construction progress. Upon our team's arrival in Lima on Friday, May 25, after rest and a meal, part of our team will travel around Lima purchasing PVC pipes, water filters, UV lights and all the nuts and bolts from Lima's Home Depot-like hardware stores. Meanwhile, others may be found shopping for the Alternative Christmas Market items, such as angels and friendship bracelets.

The health team plans, prepares and shops for their curriculum in the States, transporting supplies in plastic boxes inside their luggage. All supplies are left behind as a donation to the school. On Monday, May 28, the water system installation and training will begin. The Health Education team will assemble teachers and will review the Living Waters curriculum with them. After that, they watch the teachers teach their classes. On the last day, the 102 team prepares a celebration for the ribbon cutting party and clean water is passed around for everyone to drink!

There is always the unexpected, many good meals, laughter and tourism. But make no mistake, a Living Waters installation is not a vacation, rather a few days of hard work with a stressful deadline to get everything operational before leaving. Prayers for all the people working on this project are appreciated as is all the support they have received from our congregation This will be San Gabriel's 9th year in Peru, our seventh installation, and Irene Atwood's first trip as a Living Water for the World participant.

# Come Build Hope -Exploring Partnership in Mexico

ur Mission Commission has been exploring the possibility of extending our work with Living Waters for the World into northern Baja in Mexico. To that end, several CPC members, along with Pastor Karen, traveled to Tijuana in March for a meeting between leaders of Mexican Presbyterian congregations in that region and leaders from San Diego Presbytery. While there, we learned of this opportunity to participate in an event with a church in Rosarito Beach, Tijuana and Solana Beach Presbyterian Church in San Diego. We hope that some of our CPC members will participate and help us continue to explore the possibility of having an international partnership close at hand.


