From the Pastor

Your Commitment Builds Gospel-Shaped Dreams

In the beginning...the Church did not have large buildings or an established clergy or a calendar full of meetings and programs. What it did have was visions and dreams shaped by the gospel of Jesus who proclaimed that the Kingdom of God has come near. It was these gospel-shaped dreams and visions, inspired by the Holy Spirit, that propelled the disciples out of Jerusalem and into the world. Upon the platform of their commitment to Christ, their love for each other, and their compassion for their neighbors they built the church – a community of healing and blessing and of resistance to the powers of evil.

In the beginning...Claremont Presbyterian Church was simply a gospel-shaped dream in the heart of a small group of committed people who had a vision for a new church that would serve the many families flocking to the burgeoning suburb of Claremont from around Southern California and other parts of the United States. They dreamed of a church that would nurture children in faith, embrace families in loving community, and shepherd adults into strong and compassionate Christians who could carry on Jesus' ministry of reconciliation. Out of their commitment grew the congregation we know today.

What is your gospel-shaped dream? How can our church help that dream become reality? In the past few years, we have seen a number of gospel-shaped dreams come to life as we prayed and worked together: a new worship service called Jazz Vespers, a newly renovated chapel and classrooms, a ministry to refugees from the civil war in Syria, and a new Associate Pastor to lead our efforts to reach out to a new generation of Claremonters.

Your commitment helps our church build gospel-shaped dreams. This newsletter should reach you shortly before our Fall Stewardship Campaign materials. Please read them carefully, and watch for Stewardship videos coming to worship, our church Facebook page, and our website. Say "Yes!" to the invitation to make a financial pledge to help us experiment and build when the Holy Spirit inspires and dares.



Sundays for Children and Young Adults

Ages 0-4: Sunday Nursery: We have a wonderful nursery director, nursery assistant and volunteers from our congregation that care for and teach our youngest children. The children in the nursery learn primarily through music and play. The nursery is open every Sunday from 9:00 – 11:15 a.m.

Elementary Age Children (grades K-5): Godly Play: Godly Play uses storytelling and the invitation each week for the children to respond creatively through art, music and movement to the stories they hear to help children develop a sense of the beauty, mystery and wonder that is part of learning the stories of God's movement in the lives of the people of God. Godly Play meets every Sunday morning from 10:15 -11:15 a.m. The children are invited to come to worship at 10:00 a.m., and then leave with their teachers after "The Time with the Children."

College-age and Graduate School: Fellowship Group: This year, we are continuing with a college/grad. school age fellowship group on Sunday evenings from 6:00 - 7:30 p.m. This is a drop-in group, and it will be facilitated by a small group of adults from our staff and congregation. Any college or graduate school age young people are invited to come to this fellowship group as frequently as they are able to attend. Those who are away at college are welcome to drop in this group whenever they are back in town.



Calling All Junior and Senior High Youth

We re-launched the Sunday morning PYG's group on October 21 and we will be gathering every 3rd Sunday of every month at 9:00 a.m. in the PYG room. Come for some food, games and conversation, and a spiritual practice to help us prepare for worship.

We do have two opportunities for your volunteer assistance. November 4 is Waffle Church and we need all the help we can get. December 2 is the Advent Workshop where we will need your help facilitating crafts at the tables. Contact Pastor Brian if you can help with either of these functions.
