Sundays for Children and Young Adults

In September we have learning and fellowship opportunities for infants, children and young adults. All of the activities described below will begin on our **New Beginnings Sunday**, **September 9**.

Ages 0-4: Sunday Nursery: We have a wonderful nursery director, nursery assistant and volunteers from our congregation that care for and teach our youngest children. The children in the nursery learn primarily through music and play. The nursery is open every Sunday from 9:00 – 11:15 a.m.

Elementary Age Children (grades K-5): Godly Play: Godly Play uses storytelling and the invitation each week for the children to respond creatively through art, music and movement to the stories they hear to help children develop a sense of the beauty, mystery and wonder that is part of learning the stories of God's movement in the lives of the people of God. Godly Play meets every Sunday morning from 10:15 -11:15 a.m. The children are invited to come to worship at 10:00 a.m., and then leave with their teachers after "The Time with the Children."

College-age and Graduate School: Fellowship Group: This year, we are continuing with a college/grad. school age fellowship group on Sunday evenings from 6:00 - 7:30 p.m. This is a drop-in group, and it will be facilitated by a small group of adults from our staff and congregation. Any college or graduate school age young people are invited to come to this fellowship group as frequently as they are able to attend. Those who are away at college are welcome to drop in this group whenever they are back in town.

There is a place for you in the CPC Sanctuary Choir!



A free-will donation will be accepted to support the Jazz Vespers series as well as the Deacons' Adopt a School work at Oakmont Elementary School in Claremont to provide science field trips and materials for students.

2018 Adopt a School Project

For many years CPC Deacons have supported Oakmont Elementary School by providing backpacks, tickets to The Nutcracker Ballet and funds for academic needs. According to Principal Jenny Adams, the greatest current need is funding toward the field study trips each class takes.

In 2009 the school became Oakmont Outdoor School, with a focus on studying the different biomes of our world. Each grade level studies one of the Biomes (forest, arctic/antarctic, grassland, desert, marine and shrub land) with outdoor experiences, culminating in field study trips from one to four days.

The Deacons' 2018 Adopt A School Project will begin in September with a presentation about the school's outdoor curriculum. Donations marked Adopt a School may be placed in the offering plate, turned in or mailed to the office, or given to a Deacon after church in September.

But what are they among so many?


